Before your baby arrives.....

we will help you prepare for the birth of your child by; ensuring that you have access to adequate prenatal care, answering any questions or concerns you may have, assisting you in securing all the supplies that you will need for your infant and referring you to other agencies as needed.

After the birth of your child...

we will arrange a time that is convenient for you to come for a scheduled home visit. A qualified Nursing Faculty and Senior Level Nursing Student will come to your home and perform a full assessment of both you and your infant. We will answer any questions you have regarding support, feeding issues, parenting concerns, and safety.

All of our services are offered **free of charge** to you and your family through grants and private donations that we receive.
